Psychiatric comorbidities in inpatient medical settings are common with approximately 20–50 percent of patients having a behavioral health diagnosis. However, the rate of psychiatric consultation is less than 4 percent, revealing a gap in treatment for patients that present with a primary medical diagnosis, but also have an underlying behavioral health condition.

Many times, patients with comorbid conditions experience complications, longer stays, more transfers, and an increased risk of readmission. Due to these factors, caring for patients with physical and behavioral health conditions can cost two to three times than a patient without a behavioral health comorbidity.

All in all, hospital physicians, nurses, and other staff have not had the training in medical school or residency and are ill equipped to handle the many, diverse behavioral health problems they may face on any given day. This can result in less than optimal patient outcomes and quality of care.
